AFT NM's 58th Annual Convention

This years' annual convention was both exciting and disappointing. But only disappointing in the sense that it required social distancing that did not allow the usual fellowship, friendship and bonhomie that are hallmarks of a great gathering. Retiree members/delegates who attended the Zoom convention were: Marcia Demento, Franklin Schargel, Laurie Harris and Anne Pierce-Jones.

Two important and impactful issues were voted on and passed at the Convention. One, an anti-racism resolution and the other, a schedule change to alternating years for the state convention.

AFT NM Anti-Racism Resolution.

AFT NM president Stephanie Ly and VP Kathy Chavez released the following statement: "Building on the long history of the American Federation of Teachers fighting against racism – including the exclusion of segregated local chapters in the 1950s – this resolution calls for a greater emphasis on training of school security as peace officers, with a focus on non-violent resolution techniques, and a shift away from the militarization of our schools."

Convention Schedules

Going forward, the state AFT convention will be held on even numbered years. In the past our Union has held yearly conventions for <u>delegates</u> from the New Mexico locals, followed by "leadership training/summer school/professional development" open to <u>all</u> union members. Beginning in 2021, odd numbered years will be for statewide professional development. These learning opportunities have usually focused on the interests of active employees. Free Credit Check

The coronavirus has also brought scammers looking for ways to take advantage of us. If you are worried about identity theft or other scams - you can now get free *weekly* credit checks, rather than only one freebie per year. Equifax, Experian and TransUnion are doing this through April 2021. Credit reports show credit and payment history, and reviewing them will turn up any suspicious cards or charges made in your name.

"It is our understanding that a third-party entity (temp agency) is providing letters to NMERB retirees interested in substitute teaching. This letter states that the retiree returning to the classroom will be responsible for making their own individual contributions to the New Mexico Educational Retirement fund and to contact NMERB directly to determine the required amount. PLEASE NOTE: This letter contains many inaccuracies. All contributions must be submitted electronically through the retiree's school or school district."

AFT - Not JUST Teachers


We are **The American Federation of Teachers**.
